The IChO involves a series of theoretical exams (5 hours) laboratory exercises, and other activities aimed at identifying the best chemistry students from participating nations from around the world. Approximately 350 students represent more than 75 countries each year at IChO. The U.S. has participated in this event since 1984. In 2023 the U.S. Team won two gold and 2 Silver medals in Zurich, Switzerland; a great performance in the history of the U.S. Team and Maryland State with gold medalist Anurag Sodhi from Centennial High School. In 2024 Eric Duan was nominated to attend study camp. What an honor! In April 5, 2025 our 11 local nominees are among over 1,600 nationwide competitors that take a national qualifying exam. From this large group only 20 finalists will be identified and will undergo two weeks of intensive training, study camp, in June 1-14th. The top four students, from this camp, will be chosen to represent U.S. in the 57th IChO competition in July 5-14th in Dubai, United Arab Emirates.

The American Chemical Society was founded and chartered by Congress in 1876. It is a nonprofit scientific and educational organization dedicated to the advancement of chemistry in the public interest, serving about 160,000 members. The Maryland Section is one of 186 local sections across the nation serving more than 2,000 members.
